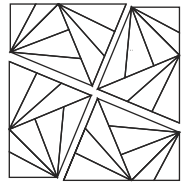
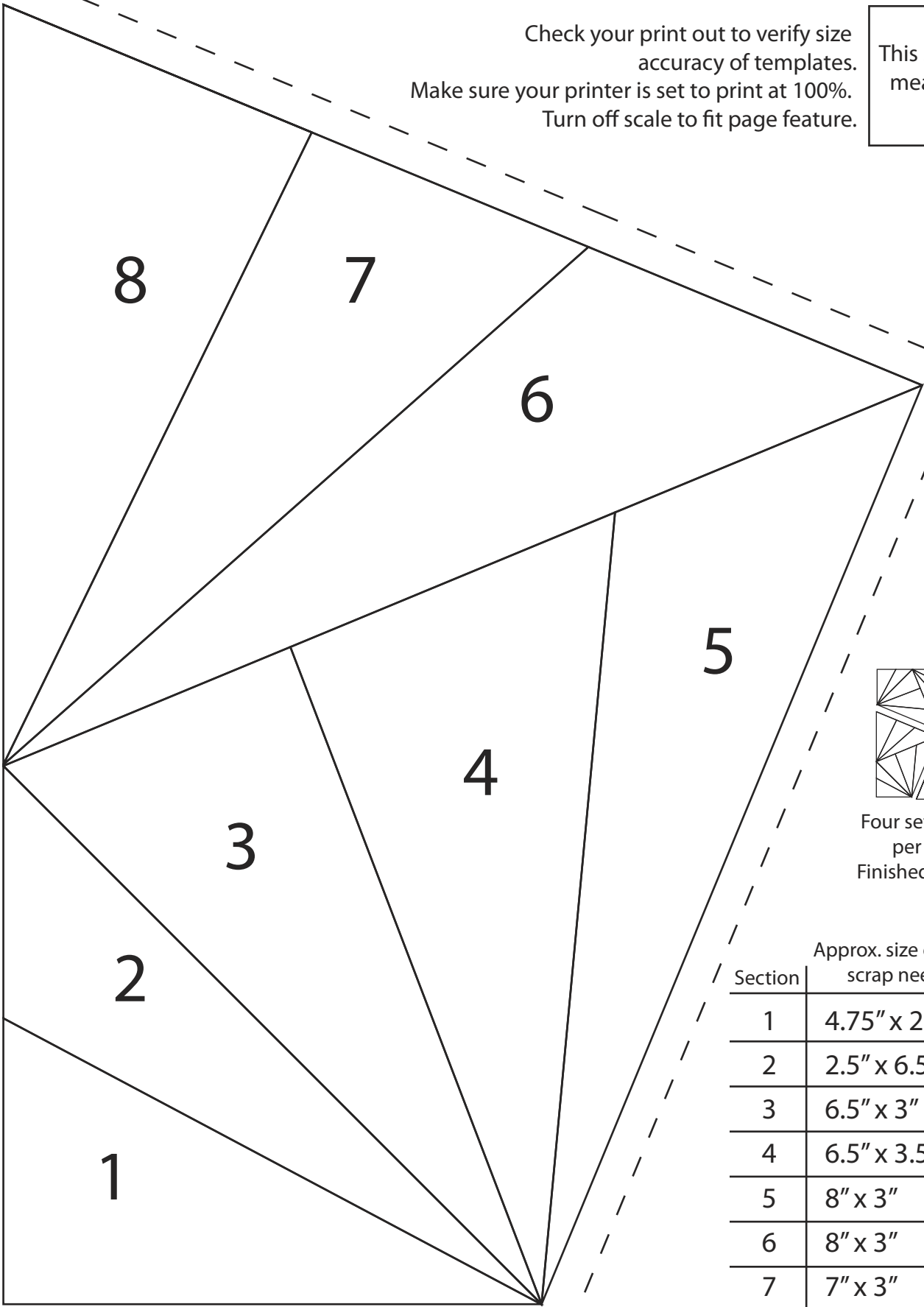


Check your print out to verify size accuracy of templates.
 Make sure your printer is set to print at 100%.
 Turn off scale to fit page feature.

This square measures 1"



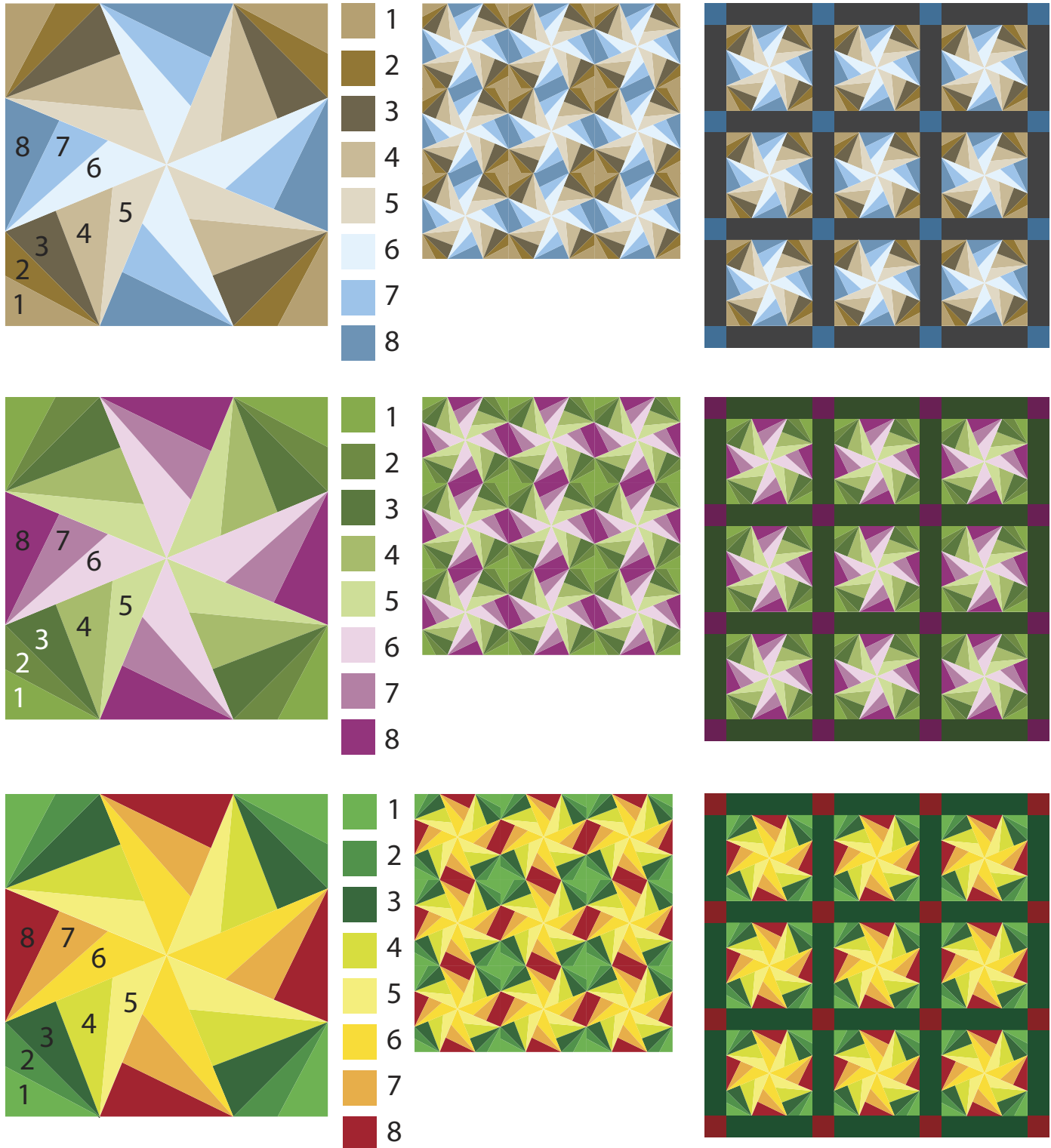
Four sets needed per block.
 Finished size: 13.5"

| Section | Approx. size of fabric scrap needed |
|---------|-------------------------------------|
| 1 | 4.75" x 2.75" |
| 2 | 2.5" x 6.5" |
| 3 | 6.5" x 3" |
| 4 | 6.5" x 3.5" |
| 5 | 8" x 3" |
| 6 | 8" x 3" |
| 7 | 7" x 3" |
| 8 | 6.5" x 3.5" |

How to choose fabrics for Spinner Block:

1, 2, 3- a run of medium to dark of one hue with 1 being the medium tone, 3 being darkest.
 4 & 5- same hue but with 4 being a lighter medium and 5 being the lightest

6, 7, 8- a run of light to dark of another hue (complementary or analogous depending on your tastes.)





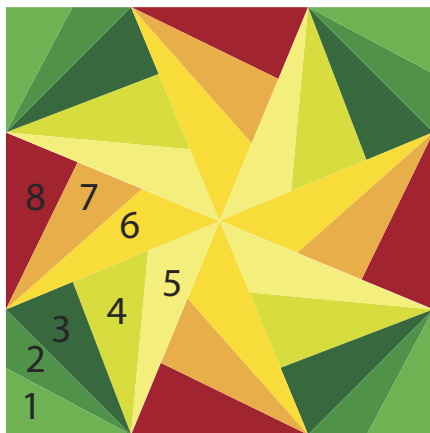
Note: The finished block will be in the reverse of the template.



Paper template with fabrics already sewn and trimmed.

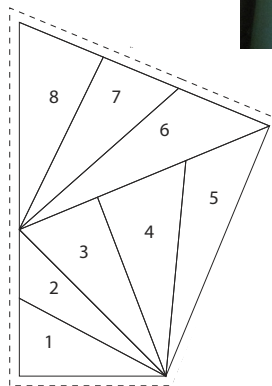


Another take on the Spinner block.

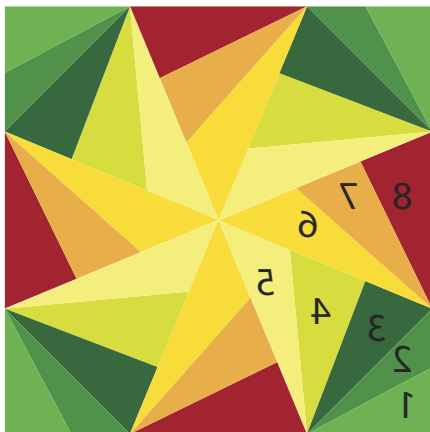


Template orientation.
